The fun, spy-game learning program assists your child in learning how to feel happier, calmer, and braver in social situations, and how to use these skills to build and maintain friendships.

Children will help them develop:

- Recognising emotions in themselves and others
- Expressing their thoughts and feelings in appropriate and calm ways
- Playing with others, using strategies such as taking turns and negotiating
- Negotiating mistakes, transitions, surprises, and unexpected problems
- Building strategies for making and maintaining friendships
- Knowing how to deal with day-to-day issues that come up in friendships



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Secret Agent Society Key dates and requirements



The following requirements are recommended to assist with the development of skills taught in the Secret Agent Society Sessions.

Pre-assessment: To determine the participants' baseline skills prior to commencing the group. This will enable us to determine appropriate goals for each participant.

Cadet sessions: 9 weekly cadet (participant) sessions throughout the term to teach core concepts and skills.

Parent sessions: 4 parent sessions throughout the term to provide structured and detailed insight into what is being taught and how it can be implemented outside the clinic.

Post-assessment: To determine the participants' skills on completion of the group. This will enable us to determine how far the participants have come and congratulate them on their success.

Follow up sessions: 2 follow up sessions are provided following the completion of the 9 weeks to assist cadets in transferring their skills into their social environments and review what was taught in the SAS sessions.
